School waste reduction and recycling grants

Hennepin County provides grants for preschools, K-12 schools, and higher education institutions to start or improve programs to divert recycling and organic materials, which includes food and non-recyclable paper, from the trash. Grant funding can also be used to take steps to reduce waste in the first place.

Eligible recipients	Preschools, K-12 schools, and higher education institutions in Hennepin County
Eligible expenses	 Bins, barrels, carts and sorting stations Reusable foodware to replace disposables Sharing table supplies Bulk condiment dispensers to replace single-use options Reimbursement for monitors to oversee separation of organics, recycling, and trash Stipends for staff to implement and lead the grant project
Application timeline	The following organizations may apply for the first round of grants: Head Start, two-year colleges, and preschools and K-12 schools with at least 50% of students qualifying for free and reduced lunch. Applications for this round are due Thursday, March 7 . Applications from any K-12 school, preschool, college, or university in the county will be accepted from March 20 through November 15 or until available funds are depleted.
Amount of funding available	 The minimum award is \$1,000. The maximum award is \$20,000 for qualifying applications who apply by the February 29 deadline. The maximum award is \$15,000 for applications submitted March 20 or later. \$100,000 is available annually.
Project timeline	Projects must be completed in 2 years.
Reporting requirements	Midterm and final report with progress of project.
Examples of projects	Priority is given to the following types of projects: • Food waste prevention or donation • Replacing single-use and disposable items with bulk and reusable items • Collection of recyclables in areas outside of the school building and at special events.
