
Designing a safer road for all

Project overview

We're working to build a Lyndale Avenue for today and tomorrow. Hennepin County, along with the City of Minneapolis, Metro Transit and other partners, continues to work on improving safety for all users on Lyndale Avenue South (County Road 22) between Franklin Avenue (County Road 5) and 31st Street.

In July 2022, a new 3-lane configuration was implemented on this stretch of Lyndale Avenue South as part of a pilot project. Initial traffic data and feedback from people along the corridor are generally supportive of the change.

Before construction begins to rebuild this more than 50-yearold portion of Lyndale Avenue South, we will work to build off our pilot project findings and plan for the permanent configuration. This work includes streetlights, curbs, signals, sidewalks, pavement, underground utility work, and more.
