- 3) Commissioner Anderson introduced himself and in response to questions from members spoke about:
 - a. support for \$15 minimum wage with an inflation factor,
 - b. need for housing that is affordable to those working full time. the need for public/private partnerships to develop inclusive housing
 - c. need to include transit in planning for housing.

Racial equity priorities for the county are:

- a. inequities in health services, housing support, child protection programs
- b. address systemic problems.

 - a. Expectation of council: bring back information on what community is experiencing and steps councy can take to improve the lives of residents
 - b. Issue of housing displacement: think boldly about housing at a regional level, lobby the state to take a larger role, have housing where people live. Plan for the county to be a leader in supportive housing initiatives.

- a. Child protection—upstream intervention so families don't enter the system
- b. Judicial and criminal justice system—ways to give people second chances, diversion programs to keep people out fo the syte.
